# **PUBLIC FORUM**

Prakash Parab 33 Dayna Drive – Regarding the search process for a superintendent, Mr. Parab requested that the Board be open to community input and appoint an Acting Superintendent immediately to ease with the transition, especially with the upcoming potential referendum. Mr. Parab also requested that the posting be internal as well as external and the interviews be held in public.

Doug Poye 4 Tamarack Road – commended the Board for moving so quickly with the search for a new superintendent. Mr. Poye inquired why the first discussion regarding this process requires

a closed session meeting. Mr. Poye stated that he has contacted the School Ethics Commission and NJ Schools Boards Association regarding the need for a closed session meeting and they suggested that he raised that question to the Board. Next, Mr. Poye cautioned the Board to be particularly careful in the discussions this evening, as they may relate to personnel. Lastly, Mr. Poye inquired if there are members of the Board that are close friends with any internal candidates, should those members participate in the discussions.

Brian Fabiano 19 Patricia Place – suggested that as the Board begins the superintendent search, they don't be guided by conspiracy theories that are raised, but rather they let the board attorney guide them with the process. Mr. Fabiano recommended that before the Board jumps into costly search companies they consider all their options. Mr. Fabiano suggested that the Board be open minded and don't get hooked up on titles when experience in districts like ours can carry more weight.

Gazala Bohra 1 Miko Drive – commended Dr. Alvich for her efforts as an educator in the district over the years and wished her well on her retirement. Ms. Bohra stated that there still isn't a solution to the overcrowding problem and the district needs a superintendent that has experience with addressing those challenges. Ms. Bohra expressed support for hiring a firm that can attract the talent that the district needs in the next superintendent.

# **SUPERINTENDENT'S BOARD ACTION**

A motion was made by Ms. Belko and seconded by Mr. Tufano that Board Action Item A be approved by consent roll call. Roll call 10-0-0-0. Motion carried. The vote included the Jamesburg Representative. A copy of the Board Action section of the Superintendent's Report is attached to the official set of minutes.

Ms. Arminio reported that prior to the meeting she was advised by the board attorney to have the agenda revised. The closed session resolution was revised to include: Matters concerning Superintendent Search including issues covered by Attorney Client Privilege.

Board members returned to public session and had a discussion regarding a plan for a superintendent search.

Mr. Chiarella suggested that the Board immediately post for internal and external candidates for an Acting/Interim Superintendent and an additional posting for the permanent position. Mr. Chiarella suggested that the Board set parameters for what they are looking for.

Mr. Rutsky recommended working off the current job description for that posting.

Ms. Skurbe recommended moving quickly on the posting for an Acting/Interim Superintendent and suggested that the resumes be returned within fourteen days so the Board can deliberate at the next boe meeting. Ms. Bierman concurred with the timeframe Ms. Skurbe suggested.

Mr. Paluri stated that he has been reminded several times that the most important role of a board member is selecting a superintendent. Mr. Paluri stated that the Board needs to be cautious and open during the process.

Ms. Belko agreed with Mr. Chiarella to post immediately to afford the opportunity to do some transition planning and collaboration with the outgoing superintendent.

Considering what school districts may be going through with the restart to full in-person instruction, Ms. Siegel expressed concern that fourteen days may not be long enough to get a good candidate pool and suggested that an extension in time be considered. Mr. Rutsky echoed Ms. Siegel's concerns and suggested that the Board be open to an interim superintendent who has experience with a district this size and added that retired superintendents usually do not need benefits which would be a cost savings to the district.

Ms. Arminio informed the public that the Board is presently seeking to proceed with the superintendent search on their own and not utilize a search firm. Adding that there are options with outside consultants should the Board not receive a good candidate pool on their own.

A motion was made by Ms. Skurbe and seconded by Mr. Chiarella that the members of the board of education post both internally and externally for an Acting/Interim Superintendent. The posting should list that the Board would like resumes returned within two weeks. The Board will deliberate on those resumes received at the August 18, 2021 board of education meeting. The posting should be based on the existing job description of Acting/Interim Superintendent with an attorney review of that job description. Roll call 9-0-0-0-1. Motion carried. Mr. Tufano was not present for the roll call.

A motion was made by Ms. Belko and seconded by Mr. Chiarella that the members of the board of education post for a permanent Superintendent of Schools. The posting should be based on the existing job description of Superintendent of Schools with an attorney review of that job description. Roll call 9-0-0-0-1. Motion carried. Mr. Tufano was not present for the roll call.

**Note 1**: Any member of the public may record the proceedings of a public meeting of the Board in a manner that does not interrupt the proceedings, inhibit the conduct of the meeting, or distract Board Members or other observers present at the meeting.

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The presiding officer shall determine when any recording device interferes with the conduct of a Board meeting and may order that an interfering device be removed.

**Note 2**: The Jamesburg Representative shall be eligible to vote on only those matters specifically designated in  $\underline{N.J.S.A}$  18A:38-8.1, as follows:

- (1) Tuition to be charged the sending district by the receiving district and the bill lists or contracts for the purchase, operation or maintenance of facilities, equipment and instructional materials to be used in the education of the pupils of the sending district.
- (2) New capital construction to be utilized by sending district pupils.
- (3) Appointment, transfer or removal of teaching staff members providing services to pupils of the sending district, including any teaching staff member who is a member of the receiving district's central administrative staff.
- (4) Addition or deletion of curricular and extracurricular programs involving pupils of the sending district.
- (5) Any matter directly involving sending district students or programs and services used by them.
- (6) The annual receiving district budget.
- (7) Any collectively-negotiated agreement involving employees who provide services used by sending district students.
- (8) Any individual employee contracts not covered by a collectively-negotiated agreement, if those employees provide or oversee programs or services utilized by sending district students.
- (9) Any matter concerning governance of the receiving district board of education, including, but not limited to, the selection of board president and vice-president, approval of board bylaws, and the employment of professionals or consultants such as attorneys, architects, engineers, or others who provide services to the receiving district board of education.

To the extent the Jamesburg Representative inadvertently votes on any other matter, his vote shall not be counted.

**Note 3**: Public discussion is confined to this portion of the Agenda unless permission is granted by the Board President prior to the start of the meeting or when the Board is considering a Special Agenda Item that the Board deems appropriate for public participation. Anyone wishing to address the Board is requested to stand and state his/her name and address.
